












We constantly hear compliments on Waldemar's grounds and buildings and we embrace those comments with pride. We strive to maintain five star quality in all areas of the camp. This is what has been going on behind the scenes, to do just that:

- The Swiss Chalet and Ranch House bathroom updates were finished and that completed our major water line replacement project behind the scenes.
- A new dispenser ice machine was installed at Ranch House.
- Ranchita and its 10 showers also got a complete remodel and new tile.
- A camp wide wireless internet system was installed and now covers about 75% of the Waldemar property. It is a web based Meraki system that enables all of our local and international staff to continue their educational requirements and stay in touch with friends and family and provides for all or our off-season groups to stay connected as well.
- The new gate that was built by Lars Stanley in Austin was installed this summer, along with new flowerbeds and sprinklers. This completed our front entrance project.
- We purchased and replaced over 150 mattresses this spring. We have plans to complete the upgrade on all the remaining mattresses to the pillow tops by summer 2015.
- The kitchen renovation was completed just in time for our spring groups. After removing every item from the kitchen, it was painted, new safety

tile floors were installed, new ovens and ranges were installed, new stainless tables were installed in the main kitchen area, bakery and salad department, and all new gas and water lines were run.

- A new walk- in cooler and freezer were constructed and completed in early June in our newly renovated pantry/dry storage area.
- A new central unit was installed in the Sponsors office. Four new central AC/Heat units were installed in the Dining Hall. A new commercial AC/ Heat unit was installed in the Kitchen.
- New docks and riverside walk ways were constructed in the canoe areas.
- A new stone patio was constructed on either end of the Playhouse and new structural plates were added to the trusses.

LEMON ALMOND CAKE

Ingredients:

4 eggs

5 ½ ounces superfine sugar*
½ teaspoon ground cardamom
Juice and finely grated zest of one lemon
Few drops of vanilla extract
14 ounces ground almonds
Confectioner's sugar for dusting
Crème fraîche, to serve (optional)

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°F. Lightly grease an 8-inch round cake pan and line the bottom with a piece of parchment paper.
- 2. Beat eggs until light and fluffy. Add superfine sugar a few spoonfuls at a time, beating well after each addition, until mixture is thick and creamy.
- 3. Fold in the cardamom, lemon juice and zest, vanilla extract and ground almonds until mixed. DO NOT BEAT.
- 4. Pour mixture into prepared cake pan and bake in the preheated oven for 35-40 minutes, or until the cake begins to pull away from the sides and is firm to the touch in the center.
- 5. Let cool for about 10 minutes, then remove to a cake rack to cool completely.
- 6. Serve dusted with powdered sugar and a dollap of crème fraîche if desired. Is also delicious accompanied by a spiced wine or fruit syrup.

SEVILLE ORANGES WITH CINNAMON WINE SYRUP Serves 6

Ingredients:

3 cups light red wine (tempranillo or Beaujolais are good)

1 cup superfine sugar*

1 cinnamon stick

3 cloves

Finely grated zest of ½ orange

6 oranges

Method:

- 1. Put wine, sugar, cinnamon stick, cloves and orange zest in a saucepan and stir over medium heat until sugar is dissolved. Increase heat and bring to a boil, reducing in volume by half. It should be thick and syrup-like. Let cool and store in refrigerator. Syrup can be made up to a day in advance.
- 2. Trim orange peel to expose the flesh and cut between the segments to create pretty sliced wedges free of any membrane. Squeeze the juice from the remaining membranous pulp and set aside.
- 3. To assemble with the lemon almond cake, spoon the syrup in the bottom of the individual dessert plate. Set a slice of the cake on top of the syrup. It will begin to "drink" the syrup. Garnish with the orange slices. Beautiful!

*To make superfine sugar as it is not readily available in the US...measure your sugar and put in your food processor fitted with the metal blade. Blend until soft and a finer texture. Remeasure for your recipe.
